
### A busy week in Year 2!

"We have been studying the life of Florence Nightingale. Florence visited our classroom and she told us about the hospitals in Scutari. She said that the hospitals were very filthy. She was born in 1820 and died in 1910. Her sister was called Parthenope and her parents were called William and Frances. Her family didn't want her to work. Florence and 83 nurses in the Crimean War looked after thousands of soldiers. Florence set up a training school for nurses. She knew that the diseases spread in dirty hospitals and she worked to make them clean. All of her patients called her 'The Lady with the Lamp' because



every night she walked around the hospital with a lamp. She gave the soldiers healthy food and clothes. In the last 10 years of her life, Florence went blind. She was always so gentle and kind."



#### **Black History Month**

Every year, the children at Ss Alban and Stephen participate in the Black History Month initiative. October is Black History Month in the UK and it's been celebrated nationwide every year for nearly 40 years. This month was originally founded to recognise the contributions that people of African and Caribbean backgrounds have made to this country over many generations. Now, Black History Month has expanded to include the history of not just Afro-Caribbean black people but all black people in general.

In the wake of Black Lives Matter, the children have been doing work around this already through Current Affairs and English. This year, we would like the focus to be on Art Appreciation, studying specific black artists.

In Years 1 to 6, each year group has been given a specific artist who they will be studying in class. Your child will learn about the types of art they produce, studying the various skills used such as light, shade and brush strokes. They will look at subjects used and why and what was the inspiration before completing their own piece in the style of that artist.

Over the next three weeks, children are requested to complete a homework project based on the artist they will be learning about. We would like them to research their given artist, create a fact file, a poster, a presentation, information leaflet or power point. Completed homework projects should be given to the class teacher by Friday 6th November.

Unfortunately, this year we are unable to permit any parent/carer volunteers as we usually do due to the current situation. However, if anyone feels like they could do something virtually then please do feel free to contact us via the school office.

Because of the fantastic work which was produced last year, areas within the school looked extremely vibrant with some fascinating work to learn from. We have no doubt that the standard will be just as high if not higher this year!
