What is a pattern?

- A pattern is the repeated way in which something happens or is done.
- You can find patterns EVERYWHERE!
- Patterns can be found in artwork, on clothes, on animals, in songs, books and everywhere in maths!
- Here are some examples of patterns that we use and draw in our mark making area at school!

Here is another example of a **pattern**. When we talk about patterns, we need to use key words such as: *repeated, the same, and again*.



The colours yellow and green are <u>repeated</u>. The <u>same</u> colours are used. Yellow then green, yellow then green and so on.

It goes yellow, then green <u>again</u> and <u>again</u>.
