How can I get involved?

There are a number of ways in which parents can get involved in services. Herts Parent Carer Involvement is a forum for parents to get more



involved in the shaping and improving of services for children with additional needs. A parent carer forum is a group of parents and carers of disabled children who work with local authorities, education, health and other providers to make sure the services they plan and deliver meet the needs of disabled children and families. Forums usually have a steering group of parents who lead this work and listen to the views of other parents in the local area to make sure they know what is important to them. Forums are keen to hear from as many parent carers as possible.

Who can join a parent carer forum?

Parents or carers of a child with any type of additional need or disability are welcome to join. Joining your forum does not mean you have to commit lots of time. In most forums you can join and receive information, and then decide if you want to get more involved at your own pace. The forum represents the views of parents in the local area but does not advocate for individual families.

What is NESSie?

NESSie is comprised of four strands:

- Student Support for 0-25 year olds. NESSie provides quality assured arts therapists and counsellors who have experience working in a range of settings including early years, nursery, primary, secondary schools and special educational needs (SEN) settings.
- Supporting Positive Mental Health in Schools
- 2. **Staff Training and Support Forums.** Staff Forums offer support and information sharing. Themes arise from the needs of the group which may include emotional literacy, anxiety and resilience, bereavement, understanding attachment behaviours and sharing good practice.
- 3. **Linking closely with outside agencies**. These services include schools, local CAMHS commissioners, National funding bodies, DSPL management groups, local mental health and well-being groups and services. Nessie is affiliated with the Anna Freud Centre, The Judge Business School (Cambridge) and Anglia Ruskin University (Cambridge).
- 4. **Parent/Carer Support Forums**. Parent Forums have been developed locally as a platform where ideas and experiences can be shared and supported. Training, advice and information is provided by qualified therapists, and it is an opportunity to network and connect with other parents.

- Anxiety and developing resilience
- Anxiety in early years
- Bereavement and loss
- Self-harm level 1
- Self-harm level 2: Safeguarding and risk assessment
- LGBT foundation
- Assessment and evaluation: Plan, Do, Review for mental health interventions
- Divorce and separation
- Brick club
- NESSie My Time A child led, play based developmentally reparative and nurturing intervention for schools
- NESSie My World and Me An early intervention programme for children with ASD emotional/behavioural difficulties

NESSie provides child-centred support with a systematic approach, supporting not only the child, but family and professionals involved in that child's care.


SPACE for Dads football team

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Children's Speech & Language Therapy: courses for educational practitioners autumn 2019


Elklan courses offer accredited training to school staff to help them in supporting pupils with speech, language and communication needs

Following the attendance of staff on the accredited level 3 course schools may choose to undertake further training to gain whole school 'Communication Friendly' status. DSPL7 is presently funding 2 schools in working towards communication friendly status.

The cost is £300 per delegate per course, which includes accreditation fees and a Language Builders book.

DSPL 7 will fund half the cost of the course for learners attending from schools within DSPL 7 (unless you have already got 1 teacher and 2 TAs trained.). We will also fund half the cost for 1 person per PVI setting.

Early Years Course (3-5) will run over 10 weeks.



Training to support Mental Health



Free Training: My teen Brain

My Teen Brain focuses on a key stage of brain development and shows how changes in the adolescent brain, in conjunction with experience and environment, can affect emotions, relationships, behaviours, sleep and attitudes to risk.

The initiative aims to raise awareness and provide practical information and strategies to both parents/carers and professionals. Through training and a range of resources, the initiative will enable them to support young people through this time of change.

Professionals working with either young adolescents (10-14) or their parents are invited to attend a free one-day multi-agency training which will look at changes to the adolescent brain, risks and behaviours and how the learning can help a strength based approach to practice.

Kitemark Workshops

As part of the follow up from the Healthy Young Minds in Herts – 'A whole school and college approach self-review and accreditation for emotional wellbeing, mental health and suicide awareness' launch event on the 3rd April, schools are offered the opportunity to attend a Kitemark workshop, 'Speed Dating' style.

The workshop will be for 3 hours during which protected time is provided where you will be able to share ideas with other schools around 'good practice' and review areas to work on in your own school or college setting. Training for Mental Health Leads

"Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) courses are for everyone who works with, lives with or supports young people aged 8-18. They will teach you the skills and confidence to spot the signs of mental health issues in a young person, offer first aid and guide them towards the support they need. In doing so, you can speed up a young person's recovery and stop a mental health issue from getting worse."
