Grid Home Learning

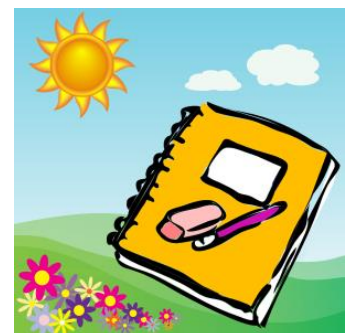

Grid Home Learning – Autumn 1st Half Term

R.E.

- Listen to a story from the Old Testament of the Bible. Draw a picture to illustrate the story.
- Write a 'Thank you' prayer to thank God for your family and all that you have.
- Make and decorate a cross to display on our Prayer Table.

Other Subjects

- Write a list of the things that you would need for a picnic with your favourite toy. You could also design a picnic blanket to use.
- Use your toys to act out a story that you know well. Can you take photographs and write a caption for each one?
- Play a range of board games with your family. Can you design your own board game? Maybe you could have a go at writing the rules.
- Choose a number between 1 and 20. Make a poster about this number. You could use collage, paint or another way of showing it. Can you show the number in lots of different ways?
- Research toys that parents and grandparents played with. What questions would you ask? What did you find out?
- What were toys like in Victorian times? What would have been in a Victorian shop window?
- Can you make a room and furniture for a dolls' house?
- Can you design a toy that children might play with in the future? What would it be made from? What could it do?
- Can you design a poster to advertise a toy?
- What do children play with in other countries? Choose a country and compare their toys to your toys.
- Find objects or draw pictures of things that you can see, hear, touch, taste and smell. Put them together to make a poster called 'My Five Senses'.
- Look at the toys in your house. What are they made from? Create a pictogram to show the different materials you found.
