 They will complete regular extended pieces of writing and reading comprehensions as well as arithmetic practise and times tables practise.
- Spellings will be given out on a Monday and tested on the Friday of the same week.
- Maths homework will be set via the MyMaths website on a Monday, and will be due on the Friday of the same week.

- Throughout the year we will also look at two other religions, one of which will be Judaism.


History

Spring: World's Kitchen


Summer: Tokyo/2021 Olympics

 - Electricity (spread over two terms)





Other lessons

 Where possible, we will try and link other lessons (such as art, Design and Technology etc.) to topics we are covering in other lessons (such as making mosaics to link with our Autumn history

topic)



Homework

- We give out a homework grid at the beginning of each half term. Children are expected to complete at least 3 pieces of homework including 1 RE piece each half term.
- Maths homework is given out on a Monday and should be completed by Friday. This will usually be My Maths and is completed online.
- Children will be given a homework book to complete any written pieces of homework in, and stick their spellings sheets into. This must be brought back into school for the Friday of each week, when children are tested in their book.
- Spellings will be given out on a Monday and tested on a Friday.
- 20 minutes reading each day is essential and diaries should be updated and signed.

How to support your child

- Please make time to listen to your child read each day, ask them questions about what they have read and share stories with them.
- Support your child with their weekly spellings
- Times table practise and overlearning is crucial.
- Working with time, measure and moneyproblem solving opportunities.
- Vocabulary building discuss unfamiliar words and what they mean. Record in vocabulary books.


School Stationery

It is very important that your child comes to school every day, with the right equipment. They need to have:

A pencil case containing:

- A black handwriting pen (no biros)
- A pencil and sharpener
- A rubber
- Colouring pencils
- A glue stick
- A ruler

Other points

- Hair to be tied back.
- Shoes black and sensible.
- Nails no varnish
- Jewellery plain stud earrings only. On Swimming days earrings should be removed.
- Earrings should be removed for PE or taped up.
- Kits need to be in school every day.

Everything MUST be labelled!

Children have two PE lessons a week, on Thursday and Friday. They are allowed trainers for outdoor PE and plimsoles for indoor PE.

Children should have a track suit in school for outside PE, during the winter months. This should be in a dark colour: black, navy blue or dark green.

No jewellery or nail varnish should be worn.



When it is safe to do so we aim to go swimming every Thursday after break.
