The Day

English in Year 6

Writing

Writing is teacher assessed at the end of the year, in conjunction with other schools. The assessment follows the framework set out by the DfE.

There is emphasis on handwriting and presentation of work. Children's handwriting needs to be fluent and cursive. They are required to use black ink.

Reading

It is still just as important for the children to read regularly. They need to think about challenging themselves in what they read. Please encourage them to read across a variety of genres and text types, including non-fiction.

The SATs focus on comprehension of a text and are known for including higher-level vocabulary.

Reading records have been given out and will be checked regularly.

SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar)

Technical accuracy when spelling, punctuating and composing writing is extremely important in Year 6.

The expectations in terms of grammar and punctuation are considerably higher than in previous years.

Children will be expected to use a higher level of punctuation within their writing, including hyphens, colons and semi-colons, as well as parentheses (dashes, commas and brackets). Children should be using basic sentence punctuation (full stops and capital letters) at all times!

The children should be able to spell all the words from the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 spelling lists, as well as using their knowledge of spelling patterns, word families and etymology.

We will send out a SPaG glossary explaining all the terms in due course.

Maths in Year 6

- We are aware that there will be gaps from last year due to the current international situation. Please don't worry!
- We are going to split the classes soon to allow children to work at a pace more suited to them.
- Please work with them on maths skills and example papers that are sent home in order to consolidate their knowledge.
- If children have a different method to one you learned, ask them to explain it to you. This really helps them to deepen their understanding.

How to help your child at home

- Learn and rehearse times tables facts from 1 12 times tables in random order. Extend your child by recognising the related division facts or using decimals.
- Help your children to learn and use time, using both analogue and digital clocks. We do not teach this in Year 6.
- Children need to read scales accurately. They can practise these skills when cooking at home. Encourage your child to measure accurately when completing craft activities.

SATs

- The SATs tests in May will be externally set and marked in mathematics, reading, and grammar, punctuation and spelling.
- ❖ SATs week is the week beginning 10th May 2020.
- Writing and science will be teacher assessed.
