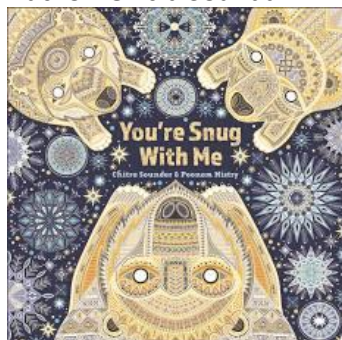

Author: Chitra Soundar

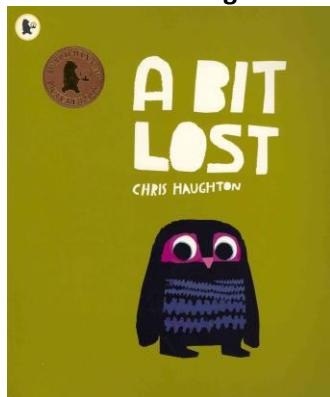

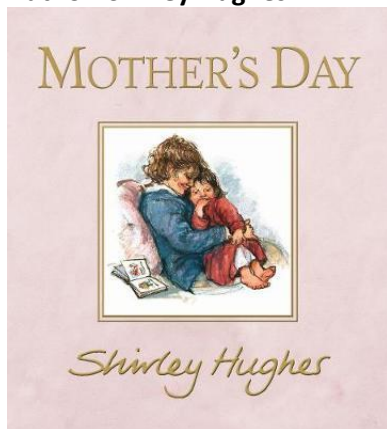
The relief of knowing and finding your mummy when you get lost and how a cuddle with tea and

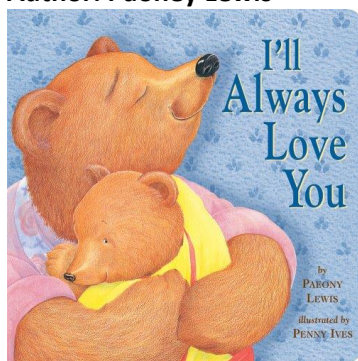


This joyous tale gives readers a snapshot into a child's day and celebrates the special bond between a mother and child.

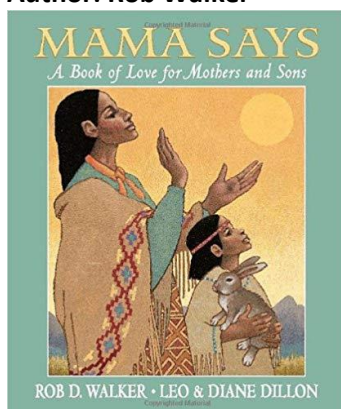


This story confirms the forgiving nature of your mummy and how much she loves you even when accidents happen.

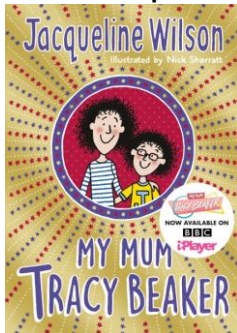


Poetic words of wisdom from a loving parent guiding their child through life. The illustrator elegantly composes multicultural mother and child scenes to capture the essence of the words.

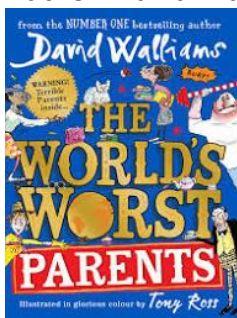

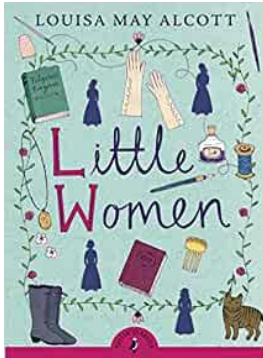

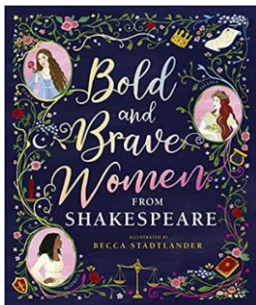
The mother figure of Mrs March is solid and dependable - the moral compass for her children.

Title: Bold and Brave Women from Shakespeare

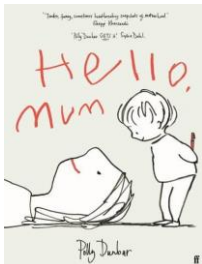
