

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you and your families are well and keeping safe. We are delighted that school will open for all pupils on Monday 8th March 2021.

In order to keep everyone safe we will continue to maintain the social distancing and hygiene measures that were in place before Christmas.

Attendance

The Government, in its guidance, states that circumstances have changed and it is now vital for all children to return to school to minimise the longer-term impact of the pandemic on their education. This means that from Monday 8th March, the usual rules on school attendance will apply: It is imperative that we work together to secure regular school attendance from the very start as this will be essential in helping children catch up on missed learning, make progress and promote their wellbeing and wider development.

School Uniform

All children should return in full school uniform. PE kits should be brought in on a Monday and taken home on a Friday to be washed.

Additional Resources

- o Children are allowed to bring in a labelled water bottle and a book bag or school bag.
- o Children in the Early Years and Key Stage 1 are provided with a break time fruit snack. In Key Stage 2, all children are encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit or a cereal bar for break time. Nut based products are not permitted due to allergies in school.
- o Children may ride bicycles to school under their parent's supervision. Children in Year 6 may ride bicycles to school unaccompanied provided they have passed their cycling proficiency. All cyclists should wear helmets and dismount their bicycles once on school premises. Bicycles should be locked in the bicycle shelter in the back playground. The child should dismount the bike or the scooter when entering the school grounds.
- o Children in Year 3 to Year 6 are allowed to bring a small pencil case to school.
- o All medication must be handed in to the school office and the healthcare plan attached on the first day. Healthcare plans are available from the school office.

Preventative Measures

We are required to retain the protective measures for children and staff. Schools have been asked to continue to minimise the number of contacts that a pupil has during the school day to reduce the risk of transmission. We will continue to have in place the following preventative procedures:

- o Lessons will be taught in all classes about the importance of good hygiene and hand washing.
- o Individuals or someone in their household who have coronavirus symptoms will not attend school.
- o Cleaning hands thoroughly and more often than usual, using the sanitiser stations positioned around the school.
- o Good respiratory hygiene, promoting 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach. Tissues will be available in every classroom to support this routine.
- o Minimising contact between individuals by maintaining consistent groups and older children maintaining social distancing, wherever possible.
- o Breaks, lunchtimes and assemblies will also be staggered to support social distancing requirements.
- o Current advice is that primary school children do not need to wear face coverings in school. You may wish for your child to wear a face covering.
- o Staff in school are now able to use Lateral Flow Devices twice a week to test for COVID-19. If these are positive, or there are any other positive cases of COVID-19 in your child's class, we will inform you immediately and ask you to keep your child at home to isolate.

Measures for arriving at and leaving school

Children will continue to enter the school grounds through different entrances. Please follow these instructions carefully so that we avoid parents and children congregating in any drop-off zone. To reduce contact between parents and carers, we are limiting drop off and collection to one parent or carer per family.

Please wear a face covering/mask when dropping off and collecting every day. All staff at the gates will also continue to wear a face covering/mask. Please bear in mind that some adults are unable to wear face coverings due to a range of medical conditions, which may not be apparent.

Catering

The kitchen will be fully open providing a hot meal for all children in Reception and Key Stage 1. In Key Stage 2, parents who would like their child to have a school meal should pre-order as normal. We will continue to use the same colour coded menu from Hertfordshire Catering Limited (HCL).

Breakfast and After School Club

Breakfast and Afterschool club provision will start from Monday 8th March. Please book on as usual.

Settling Back In and 'Catching-up'

I know that many of you will be concerned about the impact of this lockdown on your child's learning. On the return to school we will be quickly re-establishing school routines and expectations as well as working on identifying children who have found lockdown particularly difficult emotionally or academically. We will conduct assessments and plan appropriate teaching to support children to make progress. We are fortunate to have additional staff to support with small group teaching and this will be used where we feel children will benefit from it. A full academic report will be sent out on Friday 19th March so teachers can inform you about how your child is doing. As always, if you have any particular concerns, please contact your child's class teacher.

Conclusion

It will be very helpful for us to know in advance of any children who may experience difficulties in returning, or who may have had difficult situations to deal with over lockdown (such as bereavement, whether COVID-related or otherwise). Please inform us of these situations, or of any difficulties you feel your child may have upon returning to school. We have planned lots of wellbeing, nurturing and emotional-based learning sessions to welcome the children back and will support them with any understandable concerns. World Book Day is a great, fun way to celebrate the joy of books and reading.


We would also like to invite you to take part in a whole school bedtime read, if possible. This involves the whole school community reading a book at 7:00 pm on Thursday.
