Drop off and Pick Up

The doors open at 8.45am. There is a soft start to the day and when the children arrive they start their SODA (Start of Day Activity) before lessons begin. Phase leaders will be available to speak to.

Please help your child settle by allowing them to come in to the classroom independently. They enter via the fire exit door of each classroom. School finishes at 3.20pm.

<u>Lunches</u>

We use the 'Pupil Choice' system for lunch. Each child chooses their lunch at the beginning of the day Red: Meat/Fish option Green: Vegetarian option Blue: Jacket Potato

Alternatively, your child can bring in their own packed lunch.

School Stationery

Children should have a pencil case containing:

- A pencil and sharpener
- > 2 spare pencils
- A rubber
- Colouring pencils and felt tips
- A glue stick
- > A ruler 30cm
- > A purple pen

Please ask your child to tell you when they need replacements. Just ONE simple pencil case - not too bulky please.

Uniform and PE Kits

Please ensure all items of clothing are

CLEARLY MARKED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

- Children need to have correct PE Kit in school for their PE days. Our PE days are Monday and Friday.
- They are allowed trainers for outdoor PE and should have a track suit in school for outside PE, during the winter months.
- This should be in a dark colour black, navy blue or dark green.
- No jewellery or nail varnish should be worn. Hair should be tied up everyday.
- P.E kits to be brought in on Mondays and kept in school until Fridays.

<u>English in Year 6</u>

Writing

- Writing is teacher assessed at the end of the year, in conjunction with other schools. The assessment follows the framework set out by the DfE.
- There is emphasis on handwriting and presentation of work. Children's handwriting needs to be fluent and cursive. They are required to use black ink.

> Reading

- It is still just as important for the children to read regularly. They need to think about challenging themselves in what they read. Please encourage them to read across a variety of genres and text types, including non-fiction.
- The SATs focus on comprehension of a text and are known for including higher-level vocabulary.
- Reading records have been given out and will be checked regularly.

How to help your child with Reading

- By encouraging a variety of strategies to decode words e.g. using the sounds of letters.
- > By asking your child about what has happened in the story so far.
- > By asking them to make predictions about what will happen.
- > By reading a variety of texts of different genres and authors.
- > By discussing the text: I wonder...? Why...? What...? How...? Who...?
- By reading less accessible texts to them/together and discussing them

Even when the children become free readers they still need to read aloud to an adult regularly <u>and</u>to hear adults reading aloud to them.

SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar)

- Fechnical accuracy when spelling, punctuating and composing writing is extremely important in Year 6.
- > The expectations in terms of grammar and punctuation are considerably higher than in previous years.
- Children will be expected to use a higher level of punctuation within their writing, including hyphens, colons and semicolons, as well as parentheses (dashes, commas and brackets). Children should be using basic sentence punctuation (full stops and capital letters) at all times!
- The children should be able to spell all the words from the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 spelling lists, as well as using their knowledge of spelling patterns, word families and etymology.

We will send out a SPaG glossary explaining all the terms in due course.



We expect SATs will go ahead in May of 2022. There will be a parent meeting nearer the time.

CGP SATs packs will be available to buy from school, during the Autumn Term.

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- On Wednesday new spellings will be given via Google Classroom. Maths homework will also be set on a Wednesday either via MyMaths or Google Classroom.
- The spellings and maths homework are due by the following Monday morning. The children will have their spelling and dictation test on a Tuesday.
- > All children should read for 20 minutes a day.
- Additionally, children will receive a homework grid each half term from which they must complete 4 pieces of homework, including an RE piece, before the half term holiday.

Reading Books

Children should bring their reading books and records home every afternoon and return them to school every morning.

Your child will be sent home with 2 books. 1 book at their level and a further challenge book at the higher level, from our school library.

When a child finishes their book they should speak to their teacher or the Teaching Assistant first thing in the morning so that they can change their book.

Reading Records must be signed by an adult to acknowledge their reading, before their books can be changed in school.



Our School Library

Miss McIntyre is our school librarian, and the children will visit our school library once a week. Year 6 will have the opportunity to apply to become Library Assistants to promote a love of reading and help Mrs McIntyre in various ways.

Miss McIntyre also works closely with all the class teachers to source interesting and engaging topic related books so the children can really enjoy, read and research about fun and exciting subjects.

Miss McIntyre will also be inviting authors in to visit the children to really ignite and inspire a love and passion for reading.
