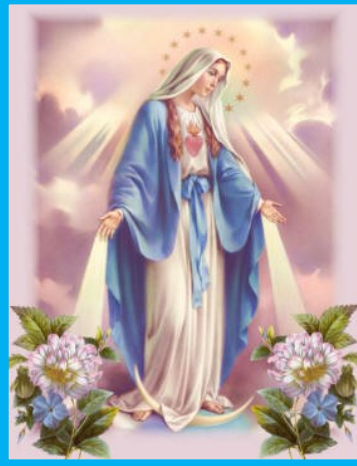

On Monday morning, we had an assembly to see who the Sport Ambassadors were going to be. We got voted by our year group and we were all so happy that we were chosen!

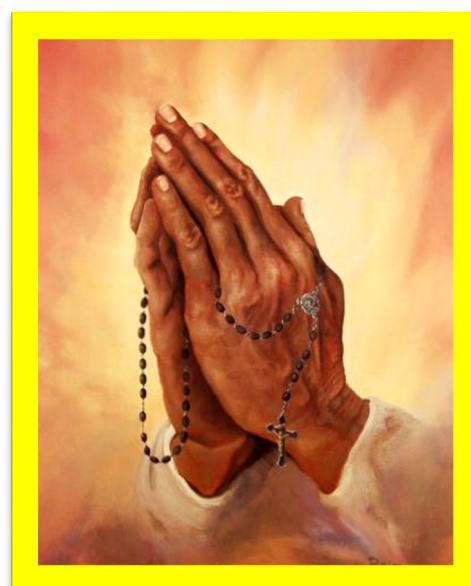
Our School Chaplaincy Team 2021-2022

Year 6 Crucial Crew Trip

“On Thursday 30th September, Year 6 took a trip to the local fire station on London Road. We were given amazing activities to help us understand how important our safety is in any situation.
