

RE: Covid Outbreak Update

You will be delighted to hear that we have seen a reassuring decline in cases of Covid-19 amongst our school community this week. Upon further consultation with Hertfordshire Public Health we are now able to relax many of the additional measures that were in place.

I would like to thank all parents, pupils and staff for your patience, cooperation and continued support during our Covid Outbreak. We are all looking forward to bringing the community back together in time for Christmas!

Sibling Isolation

We are no longer going to apply sibling isolation from Monday 29th November 2021.

Preventative Measures

We will continue to have in place the following preventative procedures:

- Lessons will be taught in all classes about the importance of good hygiene and hand washing.
- Cleaning hands thoroughly and more often than usual, using the sanitiser stations positioned around the school.
- Good respiratory hygiene, promoting 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach. Tissues will be available in every classroom to support this routine.
- Enhanced cleaning schedules, including the regular cleaning of frequently touched surfaces, classroom based resources and outdoor equipment.
- Minimising contact between individuals by maintaining consistent groups and older children maintaining social distancing, wherever possible.
- Twice-weekly Lateral flow testing for staff.

Enrichment Clubs

All Music lessons and enrichment clubs can resume from Monday 29th November 2021.

Breakfast and Afterschool Club

Breakfast and Afterschool club provision will continue as usual.

Christmas Events

We have provisionally booked in Christmas events for all year groups. Please see attached document. We ask that all parents and carers wear a face covering unless exempt for these events. This may be subject to change if Covid cases rise.

General COVID information

Symptoms

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3
 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

There are things you can do to reduce the risk of getting COVID-19:

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get to your destination
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
