What your child will be learning about this term and how you can help at home

Spring Term 2022

<u>English</u>

We will be continuing to develop our poetry writing skills with a focus on vocabulary. We will be learning how to take notes and to organise our ideas to create non – chronological reports. We will enjoy reading a wide variety of books and further develop our comprehension skills. <u>HOW YOU CAN HELP:</u>

Please encourage your children to practise their spellings each week and ask them about their learning. Encourage them to read daily and ask questions about texts to help to develop comprehension skills.

Maths:

We will be learning to create bar charts, tally charts and pictograms and interpret data. We will learn to use written methods for addition and subtraction. We will also learn to tell the time for o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. We will learn the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and develop understanding of multiplication and division by grouping.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Counting games, cooking at home – allowing the children to measure the ingredients, reading times on analogue and digital clocks.

<u>R.E:</u> Books

The children learn about the different books used in Church.

Thanksgiving

The children find out about Mass as a special time to say 'Thank you' to God.

Opportunities

We will learn about Lent as an opportunity to start anew.

<u>PSHE</u>

We will be learning about our own talents and about setting realistic goals for ourselves. We will also be thinking about some of the ways that we can keep healthy.

History – Famous Britons in History

We will learn about some important British people through history (E.g. Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria, L.S. Lowry, William Caxton):

- What legacy did they leave?
- Why are they still important today?
- What can we learn from artefacts from the past?

Geography - The World and Me

- Identify continents, countries and oceans of the world.
- Use maps and atlases
- Examine the local area around our school

Art/ D.T

We will learn to create a moving model with an axle. We will design and make boats and artefacts related to famous people.

We will learn to create a cartoon style drawing and explore the artwork of L.S. Lowry.

<u>Science</u>

Our Local environment

We will learn to identify things that are living, dead or that have never been alive. We will find out about animal and plant habitats. We will also learn about food chains.
