
So, please continue to look at the school calendar and remind yourselves of upcoming dates for the many exciting events we have as we make our way towards Easter.

### Learning in Year 5 this week

In English, we have been reading the thrilling book 'Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen. We learnt about how authors build up suspense and also used adjectives to create the word portraits of the main characters.

As part of our Geography topic of Spain, we learnt about traditional Spanish food and even had a go at cooking a Spanish Omelette in our DT lessons. The children have used a variety of cooking techniques - peeling, chopping, slicing, whisking, They even identified ways to make the omelette healthier (by adding more vegetables, using less oil and serving it with a side salad). Yum– delicious!





This half-term, Year 5 have also been learning about our solar system. The children were challenged to create a small model of the solar system using whatever resources they could find. The final results ranged from Lego arrangements to digital Minecraft creations as well as some excellent 3D models. The children also enjoyed having the opportunity to research a specific planet and present their findings to their classmates. This allowed us to gather more information about the huge distances between planets, the various materials they are made of and how long they each take to travel around the Sun.



### Maths Week Update

One of our main aims for teaching Maths at St Alban and St Stephen Catholic Primary School is that children have fun and develop a real enthusiasm for the subject. Last week during our school Maths Week the children all thoroughly enjoyed a wide range of Maths Activities right from our youngest children in Nursery, up to our oldest children in Year 6. Friday 11th February is a very special day for Mr David Miveld, our Foundation Governor, as it is St Gobnait's Day. St Gobnait is an Irish Saint and is also the patron saint of bees and beekeepers. Mr Miveld keeps bees and came into school last year to talk to the children about bees and their amazing ways. His favourite fact about bees is that to make a 1 lb jar of honey, bees will visit just over 3 million flowers. In Mr Miveld's first year as a beekeeper, he got 47 lbs of honey. Unbelievably, this means that the bees from his hive visited 141 million flowers!
