SSAS Refugee Week

This week is Refugee Week. The children have been taking part in a variety of different activities including assemblies and workshops led by the Catholic charity, CAFOD. Our aim was to understand what a refugee is and why people are forced to become refugees. We then thought about ways that we can welcome refugees to our country, city and school.

I learnt all about refugees and that they are people like us who have had to flee from their homes because something bad has happened to them. It made me feel sad for them. My class made posters to welcome them. *Nathan, Year 4*

SSAS Refugee Week

On Monday 20th June, volunteers from the Catholic charity CAFOD came into our school and ran a workshop with Year 6 children about refugees and their journeys to safety.

We were put into groups of 5-6 people and first had to choose a role as part of a family, for example a mother, child, grandparent. I was a dad!

Afterwards, we had a short amount of time to write a list of only 6 items each family member could take with them on their journey. We had to choose carefully as some items, like a mountain bike, were heavy, whilst others, such as iPads might not have been too practical. It was quite difficult to choose as we had to choose items to help our survival, even though we were used to having luxury items such as sofas and televisions.

Then, we started a 'journey' as if we were a refugee. Along the way, we ended up trading and losing some items, being separated from some of our family members (and making the difficult decision of how to separate our family) and having a family member get hurt.

Afterwards, we had a discussion about how we felt, and how this journey was based on a real family who fled from Syria. It was very poignant to think that real people had to endure such hardships.
