Praying The Angelus in Advent

Over Advent, the Prayer Leaders will be visiting different classes to teach them how to pray The Angelus. Father Andrew told the Prayer Leaders:

"The Angelus is a prayer which is traditionally said in the morning, at midday and in the evening to remind us that God became one of us in Jesus Christ. Because we spend Advent preparing for the celebration of the coming of Jesus, the Angelus is a great prayer to try out at this time. Listen out for the bells at St Alban and Stephen ringing at midday and at 6 o'clock in the evening to remind people to pray the Angelus."



This is how to pray the Angelus:

The angel of the Lord declared to Mary and she conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

Amen.

Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be done to me according to your word.

Hail Mary

The Word was made flesh and dwelt amongst us.

Hail Mary.....

Pray for us O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray,

Pour forth we beseech you O Lord, your Grace into our hearts, that we to whom the incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an angel, may by his passion and cross be brought to the glory of his resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
