# Lunches

Nursery children have the option to stay for lunch club and bring their own packed lunch. Reception children get the opportunity to enjoy a freshly cooked meal.



## **Our School Library**

The children at our school also have the opportunity to enrich their love of reading by visiting our school library. Teachers use the library to source interesting and engaging topic related books.

The children regularly visit the library and can take a book home to foster a love of reading.

We also celebrate special days throughout the year such as International Poetry Day and World Book Day.



### **Religious Education: Come and See**



The children at our school frequently engage in a range of religious teachings, such as Gospel assemblies, collective worships and weekly teaching.

Throughout the year, children will also be learning all about Bible stories through fun and expressive activities.

Our children have the opportunity to take the class prayer bear home for a weekend to write a diary and a prayer, which is then shared with the class. ## Early Reading and Phonics

As a school, we follow the 'Little Wandle' Phonics scheme.

Little Wandle provides a completely consistent approach to planning, resources and delivery across the school.

#### How do we teach children Phonics?

- We teach Phonics everyday.
- The children learn four new sounds each week and have a regular review lesson to consolidate this learning.
- Phonics is learnt in 'Phases' as a whole class.



# Tapestry


At our school, we use Tapestry, which is an online learning journal to help record all the learning and fun that happens in school.

We encourage parents to upload their own observations and pictures of their children onto Tapestry, so these can be shared in class. EG. Your child has learnt to swim OR you have visited a place of interest at the weekend.
