What your child will be learning about this term and how you can help at home

Summer Term 2024

English

In Summer 1 we will start with the mystery book *The London Eye Mystery* by Siobhan Dowd. The children will look at writing in different perspectives, and will write a scene from the book using different perspectives. Next, we will look at a non-fiction book, about how rivers are formed, and will write explanation texts linked to this topic.

In Summer 2 we will write persuasive letters linked to work we will do during refugee week. Finally, we will end the year by focusing on the poet John Agard and writing poems inspired by his work.

Maths

This term the children will consolidate their knowledge and understanding of the basics. They will look at the topics:

- Measures conversions
- Area
- Volume capacity
- Percentages / problem solving
- 3-D shapes from 2-D representations
- Reflection and Translation
- Perimeter
- Angles

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Please ensure your child practises all their times tables to 12, in random order, and that they know the corresponding division facts. Please encourage your child to use Times Tables Rock Stars.

<u>R.E.</u>

- Transformation: Celebrate the Spirit's transforming power. Big Question: How can energy transform?
- Freedom and Responsibility: Commandments enable Christians to be free and responsible. Big Question: How do rules bring freedom?
- **Stewardship:** The Church is called to the stewardship of creation. Big Question: How can I be a steward of creation?
- Hinduism: The three aspects of Brahman.

<u>Geography</u>: The River Thames. We will look at the aspects of physical geography: rivers; human geography: settlement and land use; and key topographical features of the UK.

<u>History</u>: Vikings. We will look at: Who were the Vikings?; the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the kingdom of England; who were the Vikings?; where they come from and why; family Viking life as settlers; Viking place names – Danelaw; and Alfred the Great -Gods & myths.

<u>Art</u>: We will look at the artist Claude Monet and explore the best techniques and media (pencil or paints) to recreate our own Monet style of work.

<u>Design and Technology</u>: We will be creating our own stuffed toys, using a range of different materials and sewing techniques.

<u>Science</u>: We will explore 'Amazing Changes'. We will investigate reversible and irreversible changes in our enquiries and shall be asking questions as to why change occurs. Later in term, we will be looking at the Circle of Life: Living things and their habitats.

<u>PE</u>: Summer 1: Net / Wall Tennis - Introduce/develop the volley, Controlling the game from the serve Doubles, understanding and applying tactics to win a point. Striking & Fielding: Cricket - Understand the concept of batting and fielding, Introduce throwing overarm, Introduce throwing underarm Introduce catching, Striking with intent Summer 2: Athletics - Finishing a race, Evaluating our performance, Sprinting, My personal best, Relay changeovers, Shot Putt, Introducing the hurdles. OAA: Communication- Face orienteering, Cone orienteering, Point and return, Point to point, Timed course, Orienteering competition

<u>Music</u>: Summer 1: Drumming/Rhythm and Pulse- Begin to layer rhythms to create different effects. Performing own rhythmic ostinato on an instrument. Summer 2: Improvising and Composing- Improvising melodic and rhythmic phrases as part of a group performance using Stravinsky's 'firebird' as a starting point.

<u>Computing</u>: Summer 1: Creating Media – Stop motion and Animation, creating animations, storyboard ideas and decomposing a story into small parts

Summer 2: Mars Rover 2 - Exploring how the Mars rover: moves, follows instructions, collects and sends data; understanding how computers work, what data is and how it is transferred.

<u>MFL</u>: We will be looking at a French 'Salon de Thé' which will involve learning about French café culture and we will perform a café role play, where we get to sample French foods.
