## Diocesan Academy Strategy in Context

- 82% of secondary schools, 43% of primary schools and 47% of special schools in England are academies (as of June 2024).
- All Catholic Dioceses in England have plans in place to form Catholic Academy Trusts for all their schools to protect Catholic Education.
- There are currently 58 Academies in 9 CATs across the Diocese of Westminster, with growing engagement in all Family areas.
- All schools in the Diocese will have plans to join a CAT by 2025.

## Foreword from the Cardinal...

"Now we are living through times of considerable hardship for many ..... We have to see, be clear, and readjust. This means taking difficult decisions, marked by realism, about resources. In such circumstances it is right to look for economies that can be achieved by structures of cooperation, between schools within the same locality and within the wider family of schools. This is not an enforced 'master-plan', as you well know. It is a measured and appropriate response to the reality we face. The alternative, individual schools in isolation, will lead not only to conflict but also to the decline that eventually accompanies isolationist policies. "



#### How will we benefit?

- Economies of scale and increased resilience
- Greater collaboration
- Coordination and support from an Executive Leader
- Shared back-office functions
- Greater access to capital funding
- Able (Eligibility?) to reclaim VAT (on capital works)
- Recruitment and retaining the best Catholic Leaders and staff
- Protect, secure and develop Catholic Education through a network of Family CATs supporting schools



#### What will not change?

- The ethos of our school
- The staff team
- Our Curriculum
- School Uniform
- Governors will still continue to serve on a Local Governing Body (Including Parent and Staff Governors)
- Our current admissions policy will continue to apply
- The timings of the school day
- Terms and conditions of employment



#### What will change?

- The legal status of the school and its governance arrangements
- The current governing body become a local governing body
- The Trust Board have strategic oversight of all Trust schools
- A CEO who leads the strategic development of the Trust
- The school is funded directly by the ESFA as opposed the Local Authority



#### **Governance Structure**

#### Members (5)

(Nominated by the Diocese to own the Memorandum and Articles and Association of the Trust, registered with Companies House.) Archbishop, Auxiliary Bishop, Vicar General or A Diocesan Trustee, RCDOW Director of Education, RCDOW Financial Director

Trust Board (8)

Catholic Foundation Directors appointed on a skills basis and a Catholic Executive Officer accountable to the Board

Local Governing Body Formed from existing Governing Bodies, responsible for day to day running of schools with Headteacher


