


Welcome to our School!

About our School



Our school has a fascinating history. It was founded in 1934 by the Sisters of Mercy, who opened the original school in Vanda Crescent—where our Early Years and Key Stage 1 children learn today.

In 1974, a brand-new junior school was opened on Cecil Road, on the grounds of what was once Europe's largest orchid nursery.


In 2020, the infant and junior schools formally joined together and became the all-through primary school and nursery we are proud to be now—offering a continuous, caring journey from Nursery to Year 6. Once your child has been accepted into our Reception Class, they will stay with us until they move to secondary school after Year 6.

Our pupils enjoy walking the short distance along the Alban Way between the lower and upper sites to watch assemblies and performances, and to meet other year-groups.

Our united school is inspired by the lives of our patron saints, St Alban and St Stephen. We continue to grow in faith, love, and learning—just as our founders intended.

We're proud to work closely with parents and our parish, and we have strong links with Ss Alban and Stephen Catholic Church.




What are the School rules?

8.45 am School opens for SODA (Start Of the Day Activities). All children must be in school by 8.55 when the register closes.

10.30-10.45 Breaktime for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

11.45 - 12.15 Nursery Lunch Club 12.00 - 1.00 Lunch for Reception, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

3.05 pm Reception school day ends

3.15 pm Nursery & Key Stage 1 school day ends

3.20 pm Key Stage 2 school day ends

School Meals

We love our tasty, healthy meals which are all freshly cooked on site in the School Kitchen! Children in Reception, Year 1, and Year 2 are entitled to free school lunches. If your child is in Years 3 to 6, you can either pay for school lunch, or they can bring a packed lunch from home. Any allergies can be catered for.

In Nursery, children who stay for Lunch Club can bring a healthy packed lunch to school in a lunch box labelled with their name.



Our EYFS Curriculum

In the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), most learning happens through Child-Initiated Learning, which we call ChIL time. Children learn and explore, developing their curiosity and imagination through fun, play-based activities designed around the seven key areas of learning.

Prime Areas (the foundations for learning)

- Communication & Language developing listening, speaking, and understanding
- Personal, Social & Emotional Development building confidence, friendships, and independence
- Physical Development improving movement, coordination, and self-care

Specific Areas (building on the foundations)

- Literacy enjoying stories, learning letters, reading, and writing
- Mathematics exploring numbers, shapes, and patterns
- Understanding the World discovering people, places, nature, and technology
- Expressive Arts & Design getting creative through art, music, role play and dance

Our Key Stage 1 and 2 Curriculum

From Nursery to Year 6, our curriculum journey is carefully planned to build knowledge and skills step-by-step. We bring learning to life with hands-on experiences, trips, and inspiring lessons that link to our local area of St Albans and its rich history and culture. We also celebrate the diversity of our school community through inclusive books, topics, and creative projects, helping all children to feel seen, heard, and valued.

Children in Key Stages 1 and 2 cover all the key subjects like English, maths, science, history, geography, art, music, design technology, computing, and P.E., along with Religious Education and PSHE (personal, social and health education).

Throughout the school, reading is prioritised as a key skill. We make reading fun through daily storytime, cosy book corners, regular visits to the school library on each site, and exciting events like book fairs and author visits. In addition to this, we teach daily phonics lessons from Reception to Year 2, based on the Little Wandle phonics scheme.

Breakfast & After School Clubs

We provide Early Birds Breakfast Club and Fireflies After School Club every day from Monday to Friday during term-time. The same warm and nurturing St Alban & Stephen School ethos underpins our wrap-around care. Our school staff know the children well and provide them with a calm and welcoming start to their morning, and a fun, relaxing end to their school day. Children can attend once they have settled into Nursery (and providing they are toilet-trained).

Early Birds opens at 7.45 am and closes at 8.45, when children are taken to their classes to start the day.

Fireflies starts when children are picked up from their classrooms at the end of the day, and ends at 6pm Monday-Thursday and 5.30pm on Friday.

Working Together


We truly value the partnership between home and school. There are lots of ways for parents to get involved as part of our warm and welcoming school community.
